2. Aim

At Fulbrook, students are expected to wear the school uniform correctly. In doing so, it reflects pride in the school and the part each young person plays in the school community. It helps to promote a positive learning atmosphere and a readiness to learn; it supports good behaviour. It helps to protect the school's young people from social pressures and bullying. It is an outward sign of each student's commitment to the school and helps to instil a sense of belonging.

3. Expectations

Students are required to wear full school uniform at all times, including to and from school. Dealing with inappropriate uniform matters detracts from time devoted to learning. Students who are not in the correct uniform and who do not have a reasonable explanation (communicated from home), will be offered uniform to loan, where possible, in order to attend lessons. Contact with home may need to be made, to request that the correct items are brought into school. Refusal to change into provided items will result in a student being placed in Reset, until the correct uniform is worn.

Form tutors, Heads of Year and the pastoral team are responsible for monitoring uniforms; all staff are responsible for ensuring that students are correctly dressed in class and elsewhere on the school site. Students not wearing the correct uniform or deliberately wearing the uniform incorrectly (for example, not wearing a tie or rolling up skirts) will be issued consequences in line with the school's

behaviour policy. Students wearing uniform which cannot be rectified, may not be able to attend lessons and placed in Reset. In the case of jewellery and other accessories, the student will be asked to remove the item, which will be confiscated. If a student has jewellery confiscated on numerous occasions, a parent/carer may be asked to come into school to collect the item(s).

Should a student breach the uniform policy, this will be recorded in the STAMP booklet and associated consequences issued. The school is unapologetic about having high expectations and will work with parents to ensure that correct uniform is worn.

4. Everyday Uniform

- **SHIRT** - plain white shirt or blouse. Shirts should be buttoned up fully, including the top button, and must be tucked in at all times.
- **JUMPER** - navy blue v-neck jumper The Fulbrook branded jumper is optional.
- **TROUSERS** - must be grey and business-style/tailored. Alternatively, grey tailored shorts or short culottes may be worn.
- **SKIRT** - must be grey and a suitable length, i.e. on the knee or just above. They can be pleated, a-line or straight. Tube (lycra/stretch) skirts and skater-style skirts, as well as skirts with slits, are not allowed.
- **SOCKS** - must be plain and dark in colour, or white. No vibrant colours, patterns or slogans are permitted. Plain, dark, thick tights may be worn.
- **FULBROOK SCHOOL TIE** - this is a compulsory item.
- **SHOES** - black shoes that fully enclose the foot and can be easily polished. Canvas or suede shoes are not acceptable, nor are sandals or boots. (see Appendix 1 – Examples of suitable school shoes)
- **HEAD COVERINGS** - Students who wish to wear a head covering, for religious purposes, may do so. Please ensure these are plain black, navy or white.
- Hats are allowed on the playground only, for protection from the sun, or from the cold.
- Coats must be dark in colour and appropriate for school – no leather or denim jackets.
- Sweatshirts, tracksuit tops or cardigans may not be worn as additional items.
- Hoodies are not permitted, other than the Fulbrook-branded PE hoodie or Sports Leader hoodie, which can only be worn on PE days/for PE lessons. Hoodies are not permitted as an outer layer, in place of a coat.
- In the event of extreme weather conditions, the uniform requirements may vary. For example, on days when the temperature is exceptionally high, students will be informed if they are allowed to remove their ties.

5. PE Kit

- **TOP** - A Fulbrook sports polo and/or sports jersey should be worn for PE. These items are compulsory and branded with our logo. They can be purchased from our uniform supplier.
- **BOTTOMS** - Plain black shorts or skorts should be at least mid-thigh in length. Black sports leggings or tracksuit bottoms may be worn in the colder months.
- **SOCKS** - must be royal blue in colour; plain white sport socks are also permitted.
- **HOODIE** - The Fulbrook PE hoodie is an optional item and may be worn on PE days only.
- **ACCESSORIES** - Shin pads and gum shield.

- **FOOTWEAR** - For PE in the sports hall – normal flat-soled trainers. Plimsolls are not permitted. For PE on the 3G pitch - only moulded-stud football boots and astro-turf football boots are allowed. Normal flat-soled trainers are not permitted. This is because flat-soled trainers cause damage to our 3G pitch. Please note that students cannot wear their 3G footwear in the school buildings as it is a health and safety issue. (see Appendix 2 - PE Kit footwear)

STUDENTS IN YEARS 5 and 6 ARE REQUIRED TO WEAR THEIR PE KIT TO SCHOOL ON PE DAYS ONLY. STUDENTS IN YEARS 7-11 ARE REQUIRED TO WEAR UNIFORM EVERY DAY AND BRING THEIR PE KIT TO SCHOOL ON PE DAYS.

6. Appearance

The following rules apply in school:

- A short necklace is permitted, if worn inside the shirt.
- Body piercings are strictly limited to a single nose stud and one piercing per ear; no eyebrow, lip or other piercings are allowed; earrings should be studs only.
- An inexpensive watch may be worn.
- Rings, bracelets and bangles are not permitted.
- All jewellery must be removed for PE lessons and some other practical lessons, as advised by the teacher.
- Students in Year 7 and above are allowed to wear minimal make-up. Students will be asked to remove any make-up which is deemed excessive.
- Hair must be suitable for a school environment and natural in colour. In Year 7 and above, students are permitted to wear their hair down, although it must be tied up for practical lessons, such as art, PE, science, design and food technology.
- False or acrylic nails are not permitted. If worn, students will be expected to give a date when the nails can be removed professionally (if this is required). Failure to remove nails in a timely manner will result in attendance at reset, until the nails have been removed.

Appendix 1 – Examples of Suitable School Shoes

Shoes should be black that fully enclose the foot and be easily polished. Canvas or suede shoes are not acceptable, nor are sandals or boots.



Appendix 2 – PE Kit footwear

For PE in the sports hall – normal flat-soled trainers. Plimsolls are not permitted.

For PE on the 3G pitch - only moulded-stud football boots and astro-turf football boots are allowed. Normal flat-soled trainers are not permitted.
